TEST YOUR INTERNET SPEED

Does your broadband internet connection give you value for your money? If you have an internet connection at your home, you should check the download and upload rates frequently. The U.S. government has mandated that high speed internet is essential to our economy and that it will be necessary to increase broadband speeds to 100 Mbps by 2020. Presently our local speeds with Cox range from a "Starter" of 1 Mbps, "Essentials" at 3 Mbps, "Preferred" at 15 Mbps, "Premier" at 29 Mbps to "Ultimate" at 50 Mbps. The majority of residents in Bella Vista use the "Preferred" program which allows for email, surfing the web, video or social media and photography. With the "Preferred" group, the program "Skype" works well.

The average broadband internet speeds in the U.S. rank 12th in the world. We're presently behind Romania, Korea and Japan and most of Europe. You can put your ISP to the test and find out how fast or slow your connection is and how you compare to other ISPs. There are several different speed test programs. Check it out by going to www.speedtest.com. You can also check different speeds connecting to different locations on the map.

A GREAT DICTIONARY

<u>Askdefine.com</u> is an online dictionary for looking up English words. It has many features such as

- An extensive library of words
- A very printer friendly mode
- Auto completion when searching for words
- Multisource lookups of words. Some which are user driven and frequently updated.
- Translations of words from English to German, Spanish, French and many more languages.
- List of words that rhyme with a given word.

A synonyms dictionary and antonyms

The dictionary is very simple to use. If you want to search for a word you should use the top text entry field labeled "search". When you enter more than two letters, it will show you a list of words which start with those two letters. This enables you to find words even if you don't know their complete spelling. If you click a word from the dropdown list you will automatically be sent to that article.

If you already know the spelling of the word you can immediately look it up simply by entering the word followed by .askdefine in the address bar of your browser, like this test.askdefine.com, which will look up the word "test" in our list of dictionary references.

You can also browse for words that are similar by following the links up to the left and to the right of the top of the page. This will allow you to explore the dictionary words by word if you like, much like a synonyms dictionary, only by spelling. There is also a thesaurus included in the list of each word of course.

In addition, the site is absolutely absent of any popups and advertisements, which is commonly found in other dictionary programs.

Editor's note: I also keep this program as a "favorite".

"Just because the company that made your computer installed McAfee or Norton on it, does not mean that McAfee or Norton are the best for your computer. It doesn't mean they're even good for your computer. It doesn't mean anything at all.

Do you know why Dell, HP, and other computer companies install McAfee or Norton more than other security software? No, it's not because it's the best. It's not because it works well with your brand of computer. It's not because it's

easier to use. It's not because it keeps you safer. It's not because of anything at all other than money. Computer manufacturers load your computer down with trial-ware hoping you will believe because they put it on your computer you'll assume it's good for your computer, you need it, or that you'll think it's the best software for whatever purpose it serves. But nothing could be further from the truth. Like so many things in this world, it's all about the money. You'd think when you buy a new computer they'd want that computer to run as well as it possibly could. However, loading up a new computer with all kinds of trial-ware only makes it run slower. When you add Norton or McAfee to the mix it's a sure recipe for a slower computer.

In recent days we've had a couple of users who were getting warnings about a Trojan in a perfectly safe program we had recommended. It was a false positive. Both were using McAfee; it was yet another false-positive. All anti-virus programs will occasionally show false-positives, but none more than Norton and McAfee. Anyway, when we suggested to these users that they use a better (and free) antivirus, like Microsoft Security Essentials, both indicated they had an extended "free trial" of McAfee and wanted to use it.

If you care about a better running computer - if you care about keeping your computer running at its peak, if you care about your security and safety on the Web - don't assume that what your computer manufacture put on your computer is the best for your computer - or the best for you.

The first thing we do when we get a new computer is eliminate every single trial-ware program. We wouldn't install Norton or McAfee on our own computers. So just because it came with your computer doesn't mean it's good for you or your computer."

DIGITAL LIFEBOAT

(Editors Note: Recently, I came across this free ware program information from Cloudeight. While I still use a external hard drive (image-based backup) in case my computer crashes. In addition, I am using Digital Lifeboat for a file-by-file backup using 256-bit AES encryption used by banks and other highly secure institutions like the military.)

It's a new cloud-based backup service that allows you to backup your files to a Web server where they'll be kept safe and secure (as long as you have a strong password) for you. And what's really unique about Digital Lifeboat is that right now during their beta-testing phase, they're offering everyone unlimited (that's right - unlimited) backup space. So if you have 200GBs of stuff you need to backup - and you have a high-speed internet connection - you should take a look at Digital Lifeboat. We don't know how long the beta-testing phase will last, so now is the time to take advantage of this really great opportunity. Please keep your PC turned on and connected to the internet as much as possible. You will receive emails as we pass 25%, 50% and 75% completion of the backup.

You can also go to the Digital Lifeboat Tray Application on your Desktop and click it to see your status, pause our service, and visit you Account on our website."

RESETTING YOUR PRINTER INK CARTRIDGE

Helen Weeks offered the information gleaned from a "YouTube video" site shown below.....

- Don't you get tired of getting the message from your printer that a ink cartridge is running low and you need to run to the store to buy more ink?
- Before you do, pull out the suspect cartridge and check the end where the circuit board is. Right above the circuit board, look for a small hole. Use the end of a paper clip and carefully push into the small hole to reset, and replace the cartridge. Often, you will now see on the computer printer properties that you now have a quite a bit of ink still available. This often works for cartridges where you can-not see the ink level.
